COVID-19 DECISION TREE

Student presents with symptoms between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

Is a student experiencing COVID-19 symptoms? They include:

- » cough
- » shortness of breath
- » fever (100.4°)
- » chills
- » headache
- » muscle pain
- » sore throat
- » fatigue
- » congestion or runny nose
- » loss of taste/smell
- » nausea/vomiting
- » diarrhea

*One **bold** symptom or a combination of any two symptoms may indicate a need for a test.

**Report to Nearest Adult,
who will contact Health Services**

Student is masked and moved to a designated location for isolation ASAP.

Boarding Student

Health Services assesses student in isolation and arranges test.

Negative

Student isolates for 10 days
OR until alternate diagnosis is obtained
AND symptoms improve.

Positive

Student isolates for at least 10 days AND no fever for 24 hours AND symptoms improve.

Cohort and close contacts quarantine for 14 days.

Day Student

Health Services assesses student and sends home with testing orders.

Refer to Day Student Decision Tree.

Negative

Refer to Day Student Decision Tree.

Positive

Cohort and close contacts quarantine for 14 days.

Glossary of Terms

Isolation

Separation of sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick

Quarantine

Separation and restriction of movement of people who have been exposed to a contagious disease, to see if they become sick.

Cohort

A cohort is a group of SSM students who train, live, and/or learn together. They will have increased interactions with each other, and therefore will quarantine as a group if one member tests positive for COVID-19. They serve as our "households" in a boarding/day school community.

Alternate Diagnosis

An alternate diagnosis means you have seen a medical provider and received a diagnosis that explains your symptoms (and that diagnosis is not COVID-19).

Close Contact Situation

If you are identified through contact tracing as a close contact of a person who has tested positive for COVID-19, you will quarantine for 14 days. This quarantine is 14 days even if you choose to have a COVID-19 test and receive negative results. Also, the quarantine is 14 days even if you are asymptomatic. Public health officials may share additional information with you as well. If you are in this situation, please contact Health Services for support.
