- » diarrhea

- » nausea

Yes

Stay at home and contact Health Services.

Student

Contact a health care provider. We strongly encourage you to arrange for a COVID-19 test.

Test

Stay at home until test results arrive.

Negative

Contact Health Services. Stay home for 10 days AND no fever for 24 hours AND symptoms improvement OR obtain a medical evaluation with an alternate diagnosis.

Alternate diagnosis AND symptom improvement

Continually monitor yourself for symptoms; we'll see you at school!

Positive

Contact Health Services. Stay at home for at least 10 days AND no fever for 24 hours AND symptoms improve.

You will likely be contacted by a county health official with further instructions.

No Test

Stay home for 10 days AND no fever for 24 hours AND symptoms improve.

Continually monitor yourself for symptoms and we'll see you at school!

Household Member

Contact a health care provider. We strongly encourage you to arrange for a COVID-19 test for the individual.

Test

Stay at home until test results arrive.

Negative

Stay home for 14 days OR obtain a medical evaluation with an alternate diagnosis for the individual.

Alternate diagnosis

Continually monitor yourself for symptoms; we'll see you at school!

Positive

Contact Health Services. Stay at home for at least 14 days.

Specific timeline will be provided on a case-by-case basis.

No Test

Stay at home for 14 days.

Continually monitor yourself for symptoms; we'll see you at school!

Glossary of Terms

Isolation

Separation of sick people with a contagious disease from people who are not sick

Quarantine

Separation and restriction of movement of people who have been exposed to a contagious disease, to see if they become sick.

Cohort

A cohort is a group of SSM students who train, live, and/or learn together. They will have increased interactions with each other, and therefore will quarantine as a group if one member tests positive for COVID-19. They serve as our "households" in a boarding/day school community.

Alternate Diagnosis

An alternate diagnosis means you have seen a medical provider and received a diagnosis that explains your symptoms (and that diagnosis is not COVID-19).

Close Contact Situation

If you are identified through contact tracing as a close contact of a person who has tested positive for COVID-19, you will quarantine for 14 days. This quarantine is 14 days even if you choose to have a COVID-19 test and receive negative results. Also, the quarantine is 14 days even if you are asymptomatic. Public health officials may share additional information with you as well. If you are in this situation, please contact Health Services for support.
